


# Commission on Mountain Cartography


## **Activities and achievements 2003-2007**



### Introduction

Together with the growing social and economic importance of mountain areas, the demand for adequate cartographic base data with respect to its contents, graphic design and the media is also increasing. Especially the visualization of a large spectrum of new themes requires new cartographic methods and approaches which go beyond classical topographic cartography. During the 19th International Cartographic Conference in Ottawa in 1999, the ICA Commission on Mountain Cartography was established in order to meet these demands. Since then the commission has organised a series of highly successful workshops. The following Terms of Reference have been accepted by the ICA General Assembly for the period 2003-2007:
