ICA Working Group on Art & Cartography

Progress report 2007 – 2011 June 9th 2011

The working group (WG) on Art and Cartography has been pretty active since its creation in Moscow in August 2007, as illustrated by the following list of activities. The main goal of this WG has been to encourage and explore the interactions between cartographers, artists, designers and any other area of 'arts' (poets, writers, dancers, gamers) who work in the various aspects of mapping. Given the interest maps raise in contemporary arts, we believe that much more can be learned through a tighter interaction between cartographers and artists in a broad sense.

<u>February</u>. Conference. Art & Cartography conference in Vienna. About 130 participants for this conference organized jointly by TU Vienna and the Academy of Fine Arts, Vienna.

<u>March</u>. Launch of the website / Blog (http://artcarto.wordpress.com): 72 posts by 3 contributors and 30,000 visits since March 2008. This web site is definitely a great vitrine for the working group and its activities.

<u>November</u>. Committee meeting (Melbourne). Barbara Piatti, Sébastien Caquard & Bill Cartwright worked together on several Art & Cartography projects during a week.

Overall, since August 2007, the Art & Cartography working group has organized two international conferences (Vienna 2008 & Montréal 2010), published two books (Cartwright, Gartner & Lehn 2009; Caquard, Vaughan & Cartwright Forthcoming), two special issues of The Cartographic Journal (Caquard, Piatti & Cartwright 2009; Piatti & Hurni Forthcoming), and organized many activities during the two International conferences (Santiago 2009 & Paris 2011). We have also developed a strong international network of more than 50 artists and cartographers. We hope to be able to continue this work in the context of a new ICA commission on Art & Cartography.

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
