The commission published a book entitled "Ubiquitous Mapping: perspectives from Japan" edited by the commission chairs from Springer in 2022.

At the ICC2021 meeting, an online preconference workshop entitled "Visualization of Dynamic Phenomena and Processes on Web Maps and Ubiquitous Mapping" was held with the Commission on Maps and the Internet on 13 December, 2021. Nine presenters from many countries gave papers at the workshop.
